PWS&D In Guatemala, gender-based violence has been and continues to be one of the most obvious forms of gender inequality. To address this, PWS&D is supporting a project that speaks to the problem of violence against women. Adolescents and young women participate in workshops where they learn about their rights and build their self-esteem and dignity. In addition, the project raises awareness among young men through workshops where they learn about machismo, identify what violence against women looks like and promote commitments to eliminate it.

LEBANON CRISIS APPEAL - As violence continues to escalate in Lebanon, civilian lives are in continuing danger. Hundreds of people have lost their lives, thousands have been injured and an estimated 1.2 million people have been forcibly displaced in Lebanon.

As the situation in Lebanon deteriorates, immediate assistance is needed to address the unfolding humanitarian crisis. The magnitude of this emergency demands a response.

PWS&D will be responding through ecumenical networks and coalitions to provide life-saving essentials including food, water and sanitation, shelter, and mental health support.

Through the Canadian Foodgrains Bank, PWS&D is participating in the Humanitarian Coalition's Lebanon Emergency appeal. All donations made between September 24 – November 3, 2024, are eligible to be matched by the Government of Canada, up to \$3 million.
